

Οα 1: Arrive in Οublin Explore Clontarf Castle (Sept. 21)

Arrive in Dublin and check into the historic Clontarf Castle Hotel, a stunning medieval castle dating back to 1172. Once a Knights Templar preceptory, this castle offers a perfect blend of history and luxury. Enjoy a welcome dinner in this enchanting setting.



Óay 2: Cascles, Cachedrals,

& the Guinness Experience in Dublin (Sept. 22)

Start your day with a visit to Drimnagh Castle, known for its appearances in The Tudors and Ella Enchanted. Then, explore the magnificent St.

Patrick's Cathedral, founded in 1220, before heading to Temple Bar, a vibrant district named after Sir William Temple, whose family lineage traces back to the Knights Templar. After lunch, visit the iconic Christ Church Cathedral, famous for its medieval architecture and mummified cat-and-rat. The day ends at the Guinness Storehouse for an immersive tour and a taste of Ireland's most famous beer. Dinner will be an extravagant 13-course tasting menu at D'Olier Street.



Óay 3: Ancient Ireland

Megalithic Tombs and Templar Castles (Sept. 23)

Journey to the Hill of Tara, the seat of the High Kings of Ireland, followed by visits to the mystical megalithic tombs of Newgrange, Dowth, and Knowth, some of the most significant UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Ireland. After lunch, continue to Old Mellifont Abbey, a Cistercian monastery, and the ancient monastic site of Monasterboice, known for its stunning High Crosses. On the return journey, stop at the Knights Templar's Baldongan Castle before relaxing at the Knights Bar for a casual dinner.



Óαy 4: Journey το Cork

Castles, Dolmens, and Sacred Sites (Sept. 24)

Check out from Clontarf Castle and embark on a scenic drive to Cork. Along the way, visit the mysterious Old Kilcullen Round Tower and the massive Brownshill Dolmen, Ireland's largest portal tomb. You'll also stop at Leac an Scail, another impressive dolmen. After lunch in the charming coastal town of Ardmore, visit St. Declan's Cathedral and its Round Tower. Arrive in Cork and check into the luxurious Hayfield Manor Hotel, where dinner awaits.



Óay 5: Blarney Cascle


And the Mystical Absinthe Experience (Sept. 25)

Afterward, visit Elizabeth Fort, a 17th-century star-shaped fort. Enjoy an Italian lunch at Gallo & Galetti before a free afternoon to relax at the spa or explore Cork at your leisure. Dinner is on your own, allowing you to discover more of Cork's culinary delights.

On your way back to Dublin, stop at Grangefertagh, a ruined church with a round tower and tombs of medieval knights. Then, visit Powerscourt Distillery for a whiskey and food pairing tour. In Dublin, explore the Book of Kells at Trinity College and visit Dublin Castle before checking into the Portmarnock Resort & Jameson Golf Club for your farewell dinner.
