

Day 1: Arrive in Inverness and check into the Glen Mhor Hotel, where our journey into Scotland's ancient megalithic sites begins. In the evening, join us for a welcome dinner followed by engaging lectures that will provide an introduction to the fascinating history and significance of the megalithic sites we'll be exploring throughout our tour.



Battlefield of Culloden, Clava Cairns, Culloden House



Our day begins with a visit to the historic Battlefield of Culloden, followed by an exploration of the nearby megalithic site of Clava Cairns. At 1 PM, we'll enjoy afternoon tea at Culloden House, where Bonnie Prince Charlie stayed in the days leading up to the Battle of Culloden. The afternoon is free for you to explore or relax. In the evening, we'll have dinner in town at 7:30 PM, with a pleasant walk to the restaurant.





We start with a 2.5-hour drive to John O'Groats, the northernmost point of mainland Great Britain. Here, we'll tour the John O'Groats Brewery and enjoy a tasting session. After grabbing a bite for lunch, we'll take the ferry to Orkney. Upon arrival, we'll check into the Ayre Hotel and have dinner at the hotel.



Ring of Brodgar, Stones of Stenness, Chambered Cairn of Maeshowe, Gin Tasting



On Day 4, we'll visit several of Orkney's most famous megalithic sites, including the Ring of Brodgar, the Stones of Stenness, and the chambered cairn of Maeshowe, which features ancient runic inscriptions inside. In the afternoon, we'll have a gin distillery tour and tasting in town. Dinner will be at Lucanos Italian, offering a delightful end to a day of exploration.

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Wideford Hill Cairn, St. Magnus Cathedral, **Cuween Hill Chambered Cairn**







We'll explore more of Orkney's ancient sites today, starting with Wideford Hill Cairn and Cuween Hill Chambered Cairn, followed by a visit to St. Magnus Cathedral, known for its many Sinclair effigies. We'll end the day with dinner at Helgi's Restaurant.




Earl's Palace, the Brough of Birsay, Skara Brae, Scapa Distillery
